#### The Place

Sittilingi valley nestles between the Kalrayan and Sitheri hills in Dharmapuri district of Tamil Nadu (South India) and is home to around 15,000 Malayalee adivasi people.

This area, which is around 75 km each from Dharmapuri, Salem and Thiruvannamalai, was very poorly connected by road or phone until a few years ago.

#### The Need

There is a lack of good quality educational opportunities in the valley. The village community, prompted by Thulir's good track record in addressing this gap, requested us to help start a formal school.

After an intensive planning phase with the community, the decision was taken to start a school.

The school was started on **June 17th 2015**. It is temporarily operating in a friend's premises and it now has **45 children from 6 villages**.

# **Our Journey**

Thulir was started in 2004 as a learning centre in the Sittilingi valley with the support of friends at the <u>Tribal Health Initiative</u>.

In the last 13 years, Thulir has catered to the educational needs of around **500 adivasi children and around 75 adolescents**.

The main programmes of Thulir were,

- \* An after-school programme for the government school going children.
- \* A full time 'hands-on' basic technology course for adolescents who had opted out of school.
- \* On-site training of building artisans who specialise in sustainable construction.





#### The Construction

We would like the new school campus to provide a conducive physical environment for a positive learning process. We envisage the buildings to be:

- \* aesthetically pleasing,
- structurally sound, child sensitive and environmentally friendly,
- \* cost effective while adhering to standards.

As far as possible we would like the buildings to be built by **local artisans** in order to boost the local economy. We would also prefer to use **renewable energy sources**.

## **Progress**

Thulir Trust has bought the required land. An open well has been dug.

The walls of four classrooms are being built. Some of the **Thulir Alumni** are engaged in the construction and are learning in the process.

We are looking forward to completing the first phase of construction this year: six classrooms, an office and toilets. This will enable us to apply for government recognition to the school.

The estimated budget for the first phase is ₹38 lakhs

### **Values**

Prospective parents, teachers and other members of the village community discussed and debated the **culture and values** of this new school.

We envisaged a space where importance is given to the **tribal** culture & values, agriculture and the environment.

A place where education would not be an abstract or cerebral activity but one that integrates our **Head**, **Heart and Hands**.

We would like to create a sanctuary, where children and adults can learn and explore in an atmosphere of freedom, equality, inclusion, co-operation, dignity and joy.

We enable the children to independently forge their futures while taking pride in their **roots and heritage**.
